

Susheelamma and Smt M Kanthamma to set up the Sumangali Seva Ashrama in Bangalore in 1975. The beginning was extremely modest. With just Rs.15/- in hand and three children who needed looking after, the two visionaries set about their task diligently.

Today, the Ashrama is a much sought-after sanctuary for 100 children and 50 destitute woman. Additionally, the Ashrama also works tirelessly to improve the quality of life in several slums of Bangalore and in the rural areas too.


From a single room measuring 4 sq.mts, the Ashrama now has its own buildings, a hotel, a dining hall, a school for 400 students and a prayer hall. All this is spread across one acre of land.

Little orphaned firls with no one to turn to for sustenance and comfort. Destitute women abused and abandoned by their by their own families. Old women deprived of comfort and care at a time when they need it most.... A thousand painful stories have found new happier belongings at the Sumangali Seva Ashrama.

Remaining independent od all political and religious persuasions, this secular, not-for-profit organization has made it its mission to focus on the most vulnerable and most marginalized sections of society: orphans, widows, destitute women, the physically challenged and the un-cared-for aged.

The team at Sumangali Seva Ashrama, comprising social workers, activists and volunteers, carry out each task with compassion and quiet dedication, under the inspiring guidance and wise counsel of Smt.S.G.Susheelamma, affectionately called "Amma" by all those who know and revere her. Amma leads by example, working tirelessly to develop and promote a spirit of self-reliance amongst the residents of the Ashrama, in an effort to restore their difnity and empower them.

Since the day Ashram took its first step has been evolving continuously, serving and working towards making a difference in lives of the ones who are under privileged. It started off with a home for needy and with time, the 3 decade wiser ashrama multiplied its activities by involving itself into new action plans benefitting children, women and society.

EDUCATION

In year 1975, Ashram build its foundation towards education with a Nursery and Higher primary School in Adugodi where the children of less privileged could brighten their future.

Today Ashrama has two schools within its premises and runs a number of education programmes for adults and children, which includes

- Basavananda Higher Primary School
- Sumangali Girls High School
- Non Formal School For Rag pickers (Rehabilitation Programme)
- Adult Literacy Programme
- Library for Children
- Holiday Camp for children
- School and College Internship
- Creche or Baby sitting





RESIDENTIAL

Irrespective of class, caste, age or community women have always been tormented by the society. The abandoned women who have nowhere to go find a secured shelter in Ashrama. They find a family like environment with all the 3 shelters being in same premises. Here the young "learn from the wisdom of aged" and the old are "cheered by sallies of youth.

In the year 2000, the management of Primary Health Center(PHC) at Cholanayakanahalli and in 2003 urban Family Welfare Center(UFWC) at Palace Guttahalli has been entrusted to the Sumangali Seva Ashrama wherein more than 1.5 lakh people are benifitted every year by free services like:

Equipped with all modern amenities Ashram is maintained by the well trained staff and supervisors who take care of day to day needs of children and women. Ashram maintains a well equipped modern kitchen that feed over 800 people a day. With the help of government Ashrama women are also engaged in supplying mid-day meals to the Basavananda Higher Primary School.



Vriksha Mahadasoha- 1 Crore tree Plantation program

According to the environmental protection agencies, planting trees is a must if we want to save our planet. Trees not only remove harmful chemicals from the soil, but also help reduce the greenhouses leading to global warming. Planting trees for the environment is good as they are renewable, biodegradable and recyclable.

Trees keep in cheek the air and water pollution. Reduce global warming simply by planting trees for the environment. So, we started to plant the trees in our State to balance the ecology system.



Cancer Care Camps

Cancer is a class of diseases characterized by out-of-control cell growth. There are over 100 different types of cancer, and each is classified by the type of cell that is initially affected.





Early detection of cancer greatly increases the chances for successful treatment. There are two major components of early detection of cancer, education to promote early diagnosis and screening. Increased awareness of possible warning signs of cancer, among the general public, can have a great impact on the disease. Early diagnosis can often make a difference to how easily cancer is managed/treated and the chance of making of good recovery.

Vermi Compost Project

Vermiculture/ Vermicomposting through Earthworm is economic and easy technology to convert all bio-degradable waste into best quality organic manure. All types of bio-degradable materials like urban solid waste/ rural solid wastes/ food processing industries' wastes (Agro Waste) can be used to produce organic manure by adopting Vermiculture/ Vermicomposting process.



It is the most Eco-friendly solution to reduce the most talked about problem of global warming by reduction of use of chemical fertilizers and pesticides.

Sustainable use of self produced organic manure helps improvement of soil structure, porosity and overall fertility of the soil. It can also help in development of wasteland by use of vermicompost manure. It improves soil structure, texture, aeration, and water holding capacity and prevents soil erosion. Vermi-Wash i.e. the liquid generated due to vermicomposting is a very effective and organic pesticide. This project is undertaken to promote the organic farming.



The Rotary Club, R.T.Nagar, Bangalore joined hand with Sumangali Seva Ashrama to set up a model school for the poor children. The building cost is Rs.4 crore. It consists 13 class rooms, 3 labs, computer center, play ground, dining facility and yoga room. The project was inaugurated on 26th July, 2014. The building will be completed in 2016.





